Dear Covenant Church Family,

The Lord was going before them in a pillar of cloud by day to lead them on the way, and in a pillar of fire by night to give them light, that they might travel by day and by night. -Exodus 13:21

I love this passage. It comes as Moses is preparing to lead the Israelites into uncharted waters: Moses is about to lead them out of Egypt into the Promise Land. It wasn't going to be easy, and they would need a good navigator. In 2022, most of us realize the benefits of good navigation. We now have navigation systems that don't just tell us directions they tell us the best route, which routes might have a traffic incident, weather conditions, etc. Moses had a pretty good navigation system as well. God was going to be the one to lead the way. And on a journey that would take over forty challenging years, God was front and center to take the Israelites over every mountain and through every valley. In the end, the Israelites would get to where they needed to be because God led the way. It is a verse I lean into during these times.


As we begin the new year, there are many different things we must navigate as well. The United Methodist Church is facing the issues of ordination and marriage regarding human sexuality. Covenant is still trying to return to a place of fiscal stability. While challenges, I fully believe that if we as a community come together to discuss these (and other) things, God not only will be present in our moments, God will lead us faithfully through the journey to where we need to be!

In 2023, we will spend the entire year exploring Covenant's foundation of who we are. Each month will focus on one particular thing that will help us to navigate the waters that are in front of us: as a church during the pandemic, as a church in the denomination, and as a church for High Point and for the world. And at the end of the day, I come back to this verse. The Israelites were going on a difficult journey. However, because they allowed God to lead they were finally able to reach the promise land. My pledge to you is that I will do all I can to lead us in the direction that is best for Covenant on all fronts. And I will partner with you as we figure that out, brick by brick, month by month. If we take this seriously, I know that God will lead the way as we go on this incredible journey. I hope you will join us on this journey... we need you now more than ever!



We Need To Talk: How to Have Hard Conversations in A Contentious Culture

Mondays, January 23-February 6 at 10:30am and Wednesdays, January 25-February 8 at 6:30pm

Daily we are faced with opportunities to have hard conversations. At the same time, we are living in a contentious season where these conversations are increasingly difficult to have without conflict or divisiveness. The intent of this three-week study is to explore these conversations, learn some theologically grounded techniques for having them, and lower the tension around us even as we discuss hard things. The class will be a mix of lecture, discussion, group practice, and individual work in the weeks between sessions. Rev. Darren Alexander will facilitate this class.
