On May 6th, at a called meeting of the Western North Carolina Conference, 192 churches (around 20 percent of our churches) disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church. Over the past few years, but particularly over the last year, disaffiliation has been a key word in some United Methodist churches. But what does that mean for us at Covenant? What does this mean for you in particular?

First, I want to assure you that Covenant is going to be fine. When churches and people are talking disaffiliation, with some even voting to disaffiliate and leave, it can cause panic and concern. It can raise many questions in our mind. It can leave us uncertain for our very own future. I understand those emotions very much. Whenever there is uncertainty, there are always more questions than answers, and fear can set into our lives.

As I mentioned from the pulpit and by video, I will be talking about what all of this means for Covenant at various town halls. The first will be on Wednesday, June 7 at 6:30 PM in the Sanctuary. The second will be on Sunday, June 11 at 4:00 PM in the Sanctuary. I also will be offering a Zoom town hall on Monday, June 12 at 6:30 PM. I will be talking about how the United Methodist Church got to where it is and what that all means for Covenant Church United Methodist. As someone who cares greatly for the future of Covenant (just as you do) I want to take some of the uncertainty and fear away from what is going on in the larger denomination.

Most of all, I want you to be excited about Covenant! While these matters can be confusing and frustrating, it allows us to come together to do the best thing that Covenant does: and that is to be the church! For six years, I have watched you transform the world. More than anything, Covenant is about serving the world. And that will never change!

I hope you will join me for what I feel will be informative and beneficial sessions. And know that no matter what is going on outside of our walls, God is not only watching over Covenant, God is leading us down amazing and transformative paths. If we are there for one another, not only will we get past this moment in time, God will transform us into the people, and the church, that God is calling us to be. I look forward to seeing you at one of these meetings in June! And never forget: GOD'S GOT THIS! Faithfully,






