Dear Covenant Church Family,

When it comes to the month of February two things usually come to mind: It is the shortest month of the year, and it is a month that focuses on one very important thing: love. I also would like to offer a new thing to think about for the month of February: congregational care.

Covenant Church in 2023 is examining who we are through the many different lenses and gifts that God has blessed us with. In February, we are going to be examining (and reexamining) what Covenant is, and who Covenant is, through love and congregational care. Congregational care is a phrase that conjures up many different illustrations: visiting those who cannot leave their houses and visiting the sick are two that come to mind when I immediately think of the phrase and are an important part of what congregational care is. However, to truly be a church that is radically hospitable, I think we need to go deeper into what congregational care truly means. For me, I want us to start thinking about congregational care as something that we do each and every time we walk in the doors at Covenant. How is the person beside you on Sunday morning doing as well? Does every member of our church have a chance to be cared for spiritually? A huge part of congregational care is not just checking on each other for our physical well being, it is checking on each other for our spiritual well being as well. Are we making sure that we as a church are meeting the spiritual needs for one another?

For Covenant to truly find out who we are, we need to understand where we are from a spiritual standpoint. The last part of the Transformation Journey (the initiative that we are a part of through the Western North Carolina Conference) will be focusing on our church and our overall spirituality. How can we be for each other when it comes to our spiritual health? Even more so, how can we become a church that is truly known not just for our spirituality in the moments we are together, but in all facets of our life and ministry? For many people and churches, spirituality is something that is hard to gauge. However to truly understand who we are, it is something that needs to not just be examined, but re-examined over and over again.

And we can do that! And we do that through the lens of February's key word: love. Our love of Christ should lead us to examine our own walk with God as well as our church's. I will be spending February talking about congregational care (and how we are doing it) through the eyes of taking care of those who are the most vulnerable. I also will be exploring it through the eyes of what it means when we as a congregation become more vulnerable to how God is calling us to take care of one another. This is a time to examine how each of us can take better care of our spiritual self so then we can truly take care of those who need us the most!

I hope you will join me in February as we examine what congregational care is for Covenant. February might be short, but I truly feel that the conversations we will have in February will be part of who we are for a long, long, long time!


We are so excited for our Easter Cantatal


