DID YOU KNOW.....

A QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution) allows you to give up to \$100,000 of your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA / 401(k) directly to your church or a charity of your choice when you are over age 70 ½. Although you would not receive an income tax deduction for the contribution, the amount of the RMD donated to charity is removed from your adjusted gross income (AGI) for the tax year in which the donation was made.

This may put you into a lower income tax bracket and may allow you to avoid certain penalties that come with a higher AGI, such as:

higher Medicare premiums

higher taxable portion of your Social Security benefits

missing out on medical expense deductions (deductible only when they exceed 7.5% of AGI)

the 3.8% tax on net investment income if you own taxable accounts

can potentially minimize or avoid the Alternative Minimum Tax altogether


